

Finding HIV Care in Your Community SEEKING ANSWERS AND SUPPORT




The first step to treating your HIV starts with finding a health care provider or doctor and health center that works for you. If you get tested and received a positive result at a health center or other location, these locations can often help direct you to care. If you get tested with a home testing kit, make sure to follow instructions on the test for a positive result, which may have a HIV help hotline to call. There are also a variety of local centers and locations

to be aware of:

Health centers are local clinics found across the United States that can treat medical, dental, and other needs for health care regardless of your ability to pay. Health centers adjust their fees based on your income and family size. Even if you do not have any insurance or cannot afford treatment, you will not be turned away.
